BILLY MOLOKENG is a multi-talented man — professional painter, singer and composer. He started painting when quite young, and held his first public exhibition in 1968. Due to the generosity of a patron who recognised the artist's talent, Billy was able to attend a private art school in Johannesburg in 1971.

In his current exhibition entitled "Beauty of Africa" he explores this theme in paintings that are joyful, colourful and semi-figurative. The works are highly sophisticated and reveal a sense of humour, rhythm and movement obviously influenced by his love of music. He plays music while he paints and feels that singing and painting are related and interwoven in his work. He started to compose in 1980 and has written eleven songs, many of which have been recorded under the professional name of Billy Afrika.

Molokeng's paintings are full of optimism. The figures dance across the canvas and a harmonious mood prevails which is emphasised by the wonderful use of bright colours. There is a strong KwaNdebele influence in the stylisation and treatment of the figures. Evidence of traditional beliefs, and an affinity with the spirits of his ancestors are conveyed in his recent works.

Molokeng has successfully exhibited in Israel, Germany, Holland, Greece and Italy. His work is in private and public collections in South Africa, Europe, Israel and North America.
