ENEMY AGENT IN THE LEADERSHIP?

Dear Comrade S.G.,

Our meeting of Inkonto We Sizwe which was held at Gonakudzingwa on Sunday 1st, October which was addressed by our Commander-In-Chief under the chairmanship of the Regional Political Officer, has directed me to write you this letter so that your attention be drawn to a serious question which was posed and answered inadequately at the aforementioned meeting.

1. The question was asked by a speaker from the floor comrade Captain Lerole to be precise, he alleged that in 1969/1970, after the arrest near the Namibian border of a SWAPO combatant who went by the name of Castro who, at the time of his arrest was it is believed, Commander-In-Chief of Swapo forces. This combatant it was alleged by comrade Lerole was taken at the time of his arrest by the South African racist forces to Pretoria, from where after a lapse of time he was released. Castro subsequently re-appeared in Zambia. SWAPO removed him to Dar Es Salaam where, since the time of his arrival he was kept in detention by the government of the Republic of Tanzania.
2. At our meeting of Sunday, comrade Lerole alleged that a rumour spread in 1969/70 in East Africa during the time of Castro's detention that, Castro has confessed to his East African interrogators that he, together with somebody in the top leadership of the ANC., are agents of the South African racist government. Comrade Lerole contended that this rumour about a spy became rife and asked why is it that, up to the present time our leadership has not said anything about this alleged spy who it was rumoured is within the leadership ranks of our Movement.
3. Comrade S.G., you can imagine what a shocking reaction this question had on those attending the meeting, particularly the new comrades. The chairman lest he be accused of connivance could not stop the questioner, comrade Thabo More explained that as far as he is aware no official report was made to the leadership of the ANC by SWAPO or the government of Tanzania about the alleged rumour. In the circumstances comrade S.G., the meeting directed the chairman to bring these serious allegations
