One purpose of his attempts to block out communications, both within the country and between South Africa and the outside world, is of course to enable the regime to continue its 'licence to kill' policy with no word of its brutality getting to the outside world, nor any word of the growth of the movement for liberation.

But it is vital for the world to know of these deeds. It is vital for you yourself to know so that you can pass on the knowledge to others. You have the right to know. Don't let Botha censor what you, too, can read or see.
