- . The Japanese Foreign Ministry informed us that we can apply to Kagiso Trust for funds needed for publicity, information, regarding Negotiations. They advised our office that they will write to Kagiso Trust to that effect.
- . Send information related to our 80th anniversary with Ms.Yoko FURUYA, Japanese Anti-Apartheid artist now visiting South Africa. Please ask DAC for her whereabout.

Two different delegation from Japan will be visiting ANC in January;

- (a) IMADR for our 80th anniversary(see previous communication)
- (b) Soka Gakkai International(SGI) to deliver sports goods to Northern Cape Region of ANC(equipments for 5 sport codes in 15 towns / villages)

With OTG-Finance understanding, our Mission is allocating R 300,000 to about 10 organizations / departments, financing 12 projects. It is our aim to continue collecting funds for these projects in 7 regions of our country.(see the previous report)

- . A month ago I wrote a letter to DIA informing of my desire to visit South Africa around December ending till early January, to accompany the above delegations, visit the regions we intend to continue sponsoring and have a weekly private visit to consider where one will settle in the future.
- . We have not yet received any names for the Training Programme offered by Japanese government or names for 5 scholarships offered by SGI(3) and RENGO, Japan Confederation of Trade Union(2). Please ask both manpower and Education Department to act we tried for EIGHT MONTHS. Nothing!
- . One of our staff-member, Mr.Hirano is recuperating from heart-operation. He will join us soon.

8. The JAALA(Japan Africa, Asia, Latin America Solidarity Committee) has continued suspending funding of our office. It is 5 months now. We are considering writing them a letter this week to ask them to stop using ANC name for collecting money from Japanese people in the name of "Maintaining ANC office and Chief Representative". The people should send money straight to ANC office.

Re: Official Invitation for Jgpanese Government

Dear Comrade Thabo,

Over the past years the Japanese Government understanding of the South African situation and its complex nature has improved considerably. This understanding was reflected during the official visit of Comrade President Nelson Mandela to Japan Oct./Nov. 1990, and increased support to Black Communities through various channels and upgrading of contact with ANC Japan Mission.

Our Mission strongly recommend that the ANC impress upon other participants to the forthcoming Conference for a Democratic Future (CODESA) December 20-21, that the Japanese Government be also invited to attend, if other governments are invited. This will strengthen the resolve of the Japanese government to participate in processes to a new South Africa and reconstruction in Post Apartheid South Africa.

Even if the Japanese Government might not be in position to send a top official from Tokyo to attend, an invitation which might be passed to Consulate General in Pretoria, we will always be remembered in future bilateral negotiations with the Japanese Government for having them on board with us towards a new, democratic and just South Africa.
