It grew out of the Prison Education Scheme set u by the National Union of South African Students (NUSAS). The pro ect so t to respond to numerous re nests from ex-prisoners and others w 0 were serving sentences in South can risons and who wished .to continue their education. in this way SAPET as .heen of vital importance in ensuring that the talents and resourcefulness of prisoners of conscience do not go to waste during and after their incarceration.

'With the possibilities of mass releases. fonowinguthe litical developments of a 1990. BAPET'a role has become even more era 1. ether in terms of social. economic or political integration, the programme continues to be pivotal in ensuring that the disadvantages of years of incarCeration to the ex-prisoners and their dependents are ameliorated. and that erpolitical prisoners can contribute to the democratization process taking place in the country.
