He said that if he were a New Zealand Games organiser he would be "very troubled".

He said Australian rugby players considering the South African invitations had to realise that they would be making a political statement by accepting.

While the Commonwealth was trying to force South Africa to dismantle apartheid through sanctions they would be sending the message that "you can buy off isolation in the world".

Wallaby captain Nick Farr-Jones, Simon Poidevin, Steve Cutler, David Campese and Michael Lynagh plus one other player, possibly Andy McIntyre, are expected to be invited to play with the 26-man team on the five-match tour.

The assistant Australian national coach, Mr Bob Templeton, has been approached to make up the team's management with former British Lion and Ireland forward, Willie John McBride.

Australian Rugby Union president Mr Joe French said last night no amount of federal government pressure would stop the union allowing

players and officials to support the World XV tour to mark the centenary of the SARB.

The International Rugby Board-sanctioned tour, including two unofficial Tests against the Springboks, is planned to start on August 19.

Mr French said the ARU would pass on to players any invitations, irrespective of the Federal Government's objections.

"If I receive an invitation I will say yes and attend with the players who choose to."

"Officially the ARU neither approves nor disapproves of the tour."

"We will be telling the players that if they receive invitations it will be up to them whether they accept or not."

But the Auckland Games chief executive, Mr David Johnson, said last night that Australian rugby would be in clear breach of the Gleneagles Agreement if players were allowed to take part in a tour to South Africa.

"There's no argument about it because all this talk about individual people being allowed to do what they like is fine, but it doesn't apply to rugby," Mr Johnson said in Wellington.

"The rugby unions have a particular set of rules which requires all their players to toe the line unless they're given express approval by their governing unions not to."

"If the governing unions are (a) passing on the invitations and (b) giving approval, by giving approval they are legitimising the whole thing."

All Australian players failed to rule out the possibility of touring South Africa and said they would seriously consider any invitation.

Farr-Jones is unlikely to tour France with the Wallabies in October and said any South African invitation would complicate his decision.

"Certainly if I was unavailable for France I wouldn't like to think I was available for South Africa. That's something I've got to work out with the Australian team management and my boss," he said.

Campese, who toured South Africa as part of an invitation sevens team in 1985, said he likes travelling to the republic and wishes to tour there more often.

"I've always said that if an invitation came my way I'd have to think about it," he said.

Cutler, who has stated he

will not tour France, said: "I'd have to consider an invitation but my work commitments must be a consideration."

In Brisbane, Wallaby five-eighth Michael Lynagh and Mr Templeton both said they would have to consider joining a tour.

Lynagh told *The Australian*: "If I am given an invitation I will consider it."

Mr Templeton, a former Australian and Queensland rugby union coach, has previously confirmed that a South African rugby official had asked him "some time ago" to take an invitation team there.

Yesterday he said he would consider participating.

Until late last week, Australian players were not going to be invited to tour after opposition from SARB executive member Dr Jan Picard.

The untidy tour arrangements have seen organisers trying to establish an alternative tour.

Dr Danie Craven warned the "agents operating in the UK" to keep their hands off rugby.

"We, the SARB, will have nothing to do with such tours and we will do nothing to jeopardise our position with the IRFB."

Six die in S Africa clashes

PRETORIA: Six black men were killed yesterday in South Africa's south-eastern Natal Province, bringing the death toll there this month to at least 15.

Four men died at the hands of a crowd that set fire to their bodies at Mpumalanga township, where 31 people were killed in clashes between rival anti-apartheid groups in mid-July.

Thousands of mourners defied armed police in Cape Town to bury two ANC activists in a funeral that turned sour after more than four hours of confrontation.

Disperse

Police tolerated open defiance of orders forbidding political statements and banners at the funeral for student activists Coline Williams, 22, and Robbie Waterwitch, 20.

But violence erupted when police fired dozens of tear gas canisters to disperse mourners. Williams and Waterwitch died on July 23 when a bomb they were handling exploded near a courthouse in the Coloured (mixed-race) suburb of Athlone, where the service was held.

Anglican Archbishop Desmond Tutu blamed apartheid for their deaths.

"Our God is not a neutral God," he said. "There can be no neutrality when there is oppression. Our God is on the side of the hungry and oppressed."

Botha opens the suburb he closed

CAPE TOWN: A Cape Town suburb which has been a symbol of opposition to apartheid since the government evicted thousands of non-whites 20 years ago may once again become multi-racial.

South Africa's President Botha suggested yesterday that District Six be declared one of the first "open" residential zones under a new law that sanctions a few racially mixed areas, the Argus newspaper reported.

It was Mr Botha who, as a Minister of Community Development in the 1960s, presided over the eviction of District Six's thriving coloured (mixed-race) residents, bulldozed their houses and declared it a whites-only area.

But few whites could be persuaded to move into the scene of one of South Africa's most notorious forced removals.

The new law allowing multi-racial neighbourhoods for the first time in 40 years came into effect in March, but is expected to have little effect on residential apartheid.

Family gathers for Mandela's birthday

CAPE TOWN: The largest family group to visit Mr Nelson Mandela since the jailing of the African National Congress (ANC) leader nearly 27 years ago yesterday gathered for his 71st birthday.

Family members, including children and grandchildren from his first and second marriages, were expected to visit Mr Mandela at Victor Verster prison farm in Paarl, north of Cape Town.

His wife, Mrs Winnie Mandela, flew to Cape Town with her youngest daughter, Zindzi, and three grandchildren, but she stressed the family gathering would not be a celebration.

For Mr Mandela's last 25 birthdays the family remained at home to fast and pray.

But yesterday — possibly the last birthday Mr Mandela will spend in prison — family members gathered from Soweto, the black township outside Johannesburg, his tribal home in Transkei, Swaziland, and the United States.

Mr Mandela's meeting on July 5 with the South African President, Mr Botha, increased speculation the ruling National Party might free him after the parliamentary elections on September 6.

He was allowed last Friday to meet the five other ANC members convicted with him in 1964 and still held in prison in Cape Town.

The men were sentenced to life in prison for sabotage and plotting to overthrow the Government.

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Activists defy restrictions

CAPE TOWN—Twenty-one anti-apartheid activists defied their police restrictions yesterday by appearing at a spirited rally where speakers called for intensifying a civil disobedience campaign.

An estimated 2 000 people, led by Anglican Archbishop Desmond Tutu, attended the service in Athlone.

Archbishop Tutu and the Rev Allan Boesak urged the crowd to support a recently launched mass defiance campaign, a protest arranged by the Mass Democratic Movement, a loosely organised anti-apartheid coalition.

The 21 activists, who publicly identified themselves and vowed not to abide by their police orders, have been restricted since their release from detention earlier this year.

Police confirmed last night that they were investigating the alleged breaking of restrictions by the 21.

● A Mercury Correspondent writes that a serious clash was prevented between mourners and police who attempted to seize an ANC and a hammer and sickle flag at the weekend burial of two people described in pamphlets circulated at the funeral as area commanders of Umkhonto we Sizwe, the military wing of the ANC.

Robert Waterwich and Coline Williams died in a bomb explosion in a toilet across the street from the Athlone Magistrate's Court on July 23.

Appeals

A huge banner in the colours of the banned ANC hung from the church steeple and others decked the church walls in open defiance of a tough police presence.

Four policemen, armed with shotguns and automatic rifles, walked through the gates to seize the flags but hundreds of visibly angered people converged on the policemen.

Amid appeals for calm and restraint civil rights lawyer Essa Moosa, Archbishop Desmond Tutu, Dr Allan Boesak, Mr Jan van Eck, Mr Franklin Sonn and Professor Jakes Gerwel mediated with police who then left.

At the Maitland cemetery police ripped two ANC flags from the coffins.

A large section of the crowd surged towards police and a half-brick and stone were thrown. Police then retired while marshalls persuaded the angry crowd to do likewise as the couple were buried.
