GENERAL : 9

1. Jogene Aegeen Volunteer head of Horticulture has concluded his contract and is leaving. He has offered to come in once a week from Dodoma to assist, particularly during the absence of Bongile Njobe. The only cost to us will be his petrol - 2,000/- per week which will mean 40,000/- over 20 weeks. DVS stated that if we could not manage this sum, they may be able to assist with half. Cds. Director and Chief Rep will negotiate. Agreed that we accept Jogene's offer of assistance.

Marriages - There had been a request from a comrade in Dakawa for four goats and other supplies. which had apparently been promised by the Treasury department for his forthcoming marriage celebration. The Chief Rep underlined that only the wedding ring is provided by the ANC who are not responsible for any other outlay. This applies too in the case of birthdays, anniversaries etc. The end of year parties for workers, both here and in Dar es Salaam are the only ones which are subsidised by the Treasury. The Commissioner should ensure that all departments understand this so as not to raise comrades' expectations, and that favouritism should not be tolerated. Clear regulations should be formulated for discussion in political units. The Chief Rep undertook to send out a circular to this effect to the Political bodies. the Secretary to draw up a draft.

3. The Govt. has clearly stated that all that must move out to Mezimbu or Dakawa. remaining.

Drivers must all have valid drivers licences. He warned about the bad state of the road to Dar and appealed that drivers should not drive recklessly or when under the influence of alcohol.

He commended the Youth and Student Council Group for their fine performance during Liberation week and for their good conduct. He urged that we re-examine our attitude to volunteers whose support we rely on. They are the youth and future leaders of their countries. We must get closer to them and win them to our side.

Cd. Msimang will be taking over as Chief Rep in Kenya and a replacement will be needed for his work on education and scholarships.

1. National Days The RPC was urged to start planning for January 8th. 1985. Next year is the Year of the Youth. We should be looking ahead also to June 26th - the 30th. anniversary of the Freedom Charter.
