mane, Sifiso Mkame and  
Zamo Gumede have  
already exhibited at  
several galleries, where  
their art stood out  
because of its original-

The works of Sifiso  
Mkame, a Clermont-  
born painter, have been  
on show at a number of  
locations, including  
Durban's Cafe Geneve  
and the African Arts  
Festival, which was held

at the University of  
Zululand.

Mpolokeng, of So-  
weto, has exhibited at  
the Sol Plaatje Annual  
Exhibition and also took  
part in another three-  
man Exhibition at the  
Fuba Gallery recently.

Both Sifiso and Mpo-  
lokeng concentrate on  
township life in their  
paintings, which reflect  
South Africa's political  
crisis and the feelings of  
the people caught up in  
the present turmoil.

The third artist, Zamo  
Gumede from Durban,  
specialises in wood  
sculptures.

He has also exhibited  
at a number of places.
