Dear friends,

thank you very much for your above mentioned letter. I would like to follow your request to inform you about the items we are interested in supporting and what additional information we require:

ANC

Please see enclosed copy of a letter to the Chief Representative Mr. Tany Sedat, Bonn, dated 22nd Feb. 1982. Mr. Sedat mentioned a new project of similar size and set up as the Morogoro-Centre. We are very interested to receive more detailed information about it and could include it in the program of 1982. This project will replace our contribution towards the construction of a milk-farm in Morogoro, a proposal which I discussed with Mr. Sedat in December 1981.

SWAPO

Please see enclosed copies of the letters dated 14th Oct. 1982 and 17th Dec. 1981. Unfortunately we received no further communication from SWAPO after Dec. 1981. We expect keenly information about a poultry-project in Kwanza-Sul, Mr. Hishongwa mentioned in Frankfurt during the ICSA-workshop and also in his letter dated 25th Nov. 1981 (signed by J.O. Hafstad). After receipt of such information we could release an immediate amount of DM 10 000,- reserved for that purpose. Consideration of a contribution higher than that is possible.

We are interested in both cases to come to a long-term project cooperation. ASW - as a private fund-raising-organization - will be able to participate in the funding of self-help-refugee-projects on the basis of concrete project proposals. In our criterias we lay priority on self-reliance-programs (e.g. food-production) and education. All funds originate from private donations only and are usually project-bound. A number of individuals and groups (solidarity-groups, schools, parishes etc.) donate for a certain project regularly and expect information about the progress of the project. Flow of information therefore is most important, not only in the context of informing donors, but also to make people here in our country aware of the underlying causes of the refugee-problem.

ASW started its refugee-aid-program in Southern Africa in 1979 in cooperation with its sister organization Community Services (WFD) with a call




to all members, donors and friends to support refugees in Southern Africa. This campaign still continues.

Please be informed that I plan to travel to Southern Africa (Tanzania, Zambia, Zimbabwe, Botswana, Lesotho) in July/August in order to intensify the project cooperation in the field of refugee-aid. In this context the cooperation with ANC and SWAPO will find highest priority. Therefore I am most interested if you could give your utmost support for above mentioned requirements. I am also interested to come to London to intensify contacts, to have further discussions about possible project-cooperation and to prepare my journey to Southern Africa. Please give me an indication when such a meeting could take place and whom I could meet.

For your information I include some material about ASW.
