IN KEEPING WITH THE PRINC1PLES THUS ENUNCIATED IN THE FREEDOM CHARTER. THE AFRICAN NATIONAL CONGRESS HAS THROUGH THE YEARS PURSUED POLICIES, IN WORD AND DEED, AIMED AT ACHIEVING THOSE OBJECTIVES.
