## 5. CONCLUSION

The above is a basic proposal for the development of a national Sports Facilities Trust Fund and several regional branches. However, a crucial aspect of this proposal is that it be carried out in a timely fashion: The construction of the sports centre must begin as soon as possible so that the people in the community will be an active and efficient organisation.

#### PROJECTED BUDGET

It is important to note at the outset that the figures compiled by us represent only a rough estimate of what we believe the approximate cost per Community Centre would be. These estimates are further complicated by the fact that the centres will be scattered throughout various locations which would effect the cost. We have based our figures on what we believe would represent an average of the ten locatio.

An average Community Centre based roughly on the guidelines of the ones developed in Alexander would consist of the following facilities:

a. A full soccer field Comprising of approximately 12 00mZ, fully topsoiled and thereafter lawned together with the

necessary goal posts with a tartan track for athletics.

b. 3 X full size Tennis Courts.

c. 4 x Netball Courts / Basketball Courts.

d. 6 x Practice Cricket nets completed with matts etc.

e. A Swimming Pool approximately 40m i 10m in size.

f. Some form of Community Hall: we have budgeted approximately

R120 000 for this facit of the Centre as the costs will vary

according to the specific needs and requirements of each

community.

g. All the plant and equipment necessary to fully maintain the complex i.e. lawn mowers, irrigation pipes, security guard housing,etc.

hi. Adequate Security Fencing around the entire perimeter of the complex.

l. For every centre plans will be available from plan act.

Estimate cost for Budget purposes of a Centre of this nature would be approximately R565 000.00 per Centre.

We trust and hope that the International Community will support this unique project.
