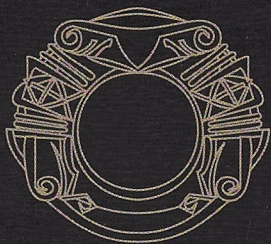

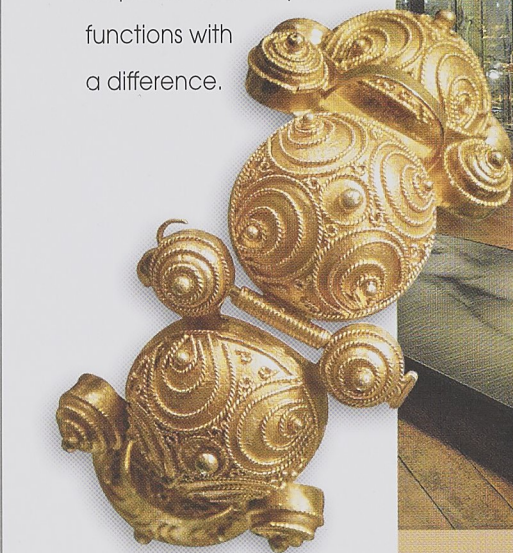
The Gold of Africa Museum complex contains:

inspire modern gold jewellery design.

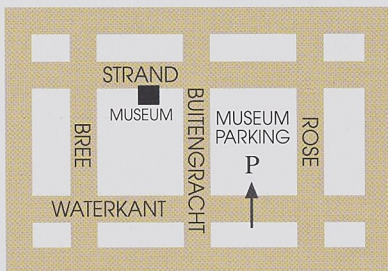
