C. General.

Minutes of last meeting held were read and referred for approval. Minimal alteration made: the word 'run' changed to 'manned' and minutes endorsed by the house as correct.

A. Feedback of developments by Ad hoc Committee.

Committee reported to have met both the D.D.C. Coordinator Cde Jackie and Cde Spencer (on behalf of Cde Dennis who is away). The ^{latter} ~~former~~ accepted next week's appointment for a meeting. The ^{former} ~~latter~~ expressed readiness to meet Cde Spencer as regards allocation of emergency house(s) for Adult Education classes.

B. Strategy to resolve A.E. shortcomings.

The house looked into this question. House accepted that something tangible must be effected as echoed by the chairman. This, it agreed upon that:

- i) Target groups be clearly defined and personnel thereof known.
- ii) Target groups to fall within three distinct group categories.
- iii) Committee to draw up programme of mobilisation by working through departments and relevant structures.
- iv) Committee to verify and know educational background of Dakawa community and that this statistical assessment of potential learners could be done in the form of a QUESTIONNAIRE passed through departments and relevant structures.

Concern was expressed as regards socio-political inactivity of some ~~Concern~~ members of D.D.C community-spouses of some ANC members. House noted with ^ that Adult Education has a key role to play at eradicating this error. The Committee must particularly focus its attention on such target group.

On ~~Tutors~~[^] was also looked into: that the conduct of comrades Nhlanhla Masina and Patrick Dube are not seen as representative image of Adult Education tutors, and as such present and potential learners are affected and finally lose confidence in Adult Education as an exemplary and responsible institute in the community.

House adopted motion that suggestion be made to D.D.C. Coordinator that both comrades be relieved of their duties as tutors. The Committee is to see to that.

General:

- i) House noted conclusively that relations between S.O.C. and Adult Education are essential and need be strengthened as is noted that the two interrelate and are part of the solutions to the educational matters affecting Dakawa community.
- ii) House informed that Mr T. Dommer-Commonwealth Secretariat Rep for S.A.E.U. may visit towards the end of July. Scope of attention is possibly D.D.C.

Progress Report from the Ad hoc Committee is expected on the first THURSDAY of July.
