Reference is made to your February 25 letter which was received on March 13 and for which I thank you.

In keeping with your suggestion that I contact your Chief Representative in Lagos, I did so on April 3, but up to now I have not heard from him. In that it is not uncommon for a airmailed letter to take more than 105 days to go from Monrovia to Lagos, be answered and returned to Monrovia via airmail, I beleive that you will concur that it would be better for me to deal with your Lusaka office. Beleive it or not, your letter was received 16 days after it was dated and it normally takes the local postal authorities two to four days after receipt of a letter before it is placed in the addressee's box. Also, Air Zambia has once a week a round trip service between Lusaka and Monrovia.


With regards to joining or forming a local support group, I beleive that there are some high personalities who might not want such an organization to flourish and who might look on its members with disdain.

Beleiving fully in the dignity of mankind and having been an active member of two of the leading American Civil Rights Organizations during the early 60's, I would like to lend my support towards your organization and its noble efforts. As such, I request that you foward to me via express airmail a membership application and complete information on the ANC and its activities. I would also like very much to obtain an ANC lapel pin .

Being one who would like to make a definite contrubition to the ANC and to those who, under its banner, everyday challenge a vicious and brutal but dieing adversary, I trust that you Sir, will honor this second request.

Yours in the struggle for a freeer, more progressive and unified Africa in which the rule of law, and not the whims of leaders, shall prevail and where the rights of all will be cherished and vigorously protected.
