GRACE LEBOOA - Lack of preparation and misbehaviour.

PUMLA MABUYA - Lack of seriousness about studies and inappropriate life style.

/LULAMA MNUMZANA - Lack of seriousness about am studies and inappropriate life style.

PAPA MOGALE - Lack of seriousness about studies, misbehaviour

ZAMA MVUSI - Misbehaviour

JLINEO MAKOA - Misbehaviour

We regret very much that the facilities of the University have been taken up by persons who have failed to measure up to the standard expected by Frelimo and by the A.N.C. The two above mentioned reasons led to their poor performance at the University.

We therefore request U.N.E.S.C.O to issue ten (10) tickets for the withdrawn students. One ticket MAPUTO - LUBAKA. Nine tickets MAFUTO - DAR ES SALAAM.

We intend booking them for their departure on the 17th of this month. The following are the students and their reasons for withdrawal:-

## RE: Student Situation (MAPUTO)

We would like to inform you that a meeting was held here (MAPUTO) between the Secretary-General, the Counselling Committee and the representation (MAPUTO) on the current (student) developments amongst the students. On this subject matter, a decision was taken wherein ten (10) of the students were to be withdrawn from the University on varying reasons.

On this matter we didn't communicate with you directly due to the directives from the Headquarters, that all communication be first directed to them. However, since the students are coming to Tanzania; we herein enclose a duplicated copy of the report with an aim to enlighten the Education Committee who are going to handle the student situation in Tanzania. We also enclose these reports because to a limited extent, they indicate our feelings and suggestions which deal with student situation in Tanzania.

We further enclose duplicated copies sent to the Rector of the University and to UNESCO (Maputo). The Rector was officially informed of the withdrawal of the students from the university. Tickets requisition was made with UNESCO and has granted them as such.

We would further like to inform you that UNESCO (Maputo) is going to instruct the UNDP (Tanzania) to pay the students of this their respective allowances which they could not receive here.

We regret of the situation that has occured, we hope that in the future things will come well.

After the meeting we held with you, we immediately began the process of sifting the students and the sifting resulted in ten (10) students being withdrawn from the University.

Following this, a report was sent to your office as we agreed with you that it should be sent as soon as possible to the H.Q. and the students were duely informed about the decision.

Enclosed herein are the copies of the letters written to:- a) The Rector informing him of the withdrawal of the ten students.

- b) A letter to UNESCO requesting ten tickets.
- UNESCO responded and gave us the said tickets.

After the decision was communicated to the students, the President and the commissar (Dilinga) interviewed the students. The commissar saw all of them except Bongani Radebe who was is still in Lusaka at the time. He saw them individualy and as a group.

In a short meeting held between the President, commissar and myself (Zuma) I suggested that the commissar after seeing the students, should see the Counselling Committee together with the office representation, the University administration and the Rector so that he should have a complete /picture

picture of the situation.

Indeed, after seeing the students he saw the Counselling Committee together with the office representation. That meeting did not change the original position taken on the sifting of the students. But the commissar made some general comments on a few students.

When asked by the commissar as to whether they wanted to leave Maputo or not, all of them individualy told him (commissar) that they wanted to leave Maputo.

The University people (authorities) that we have so far contacted on this question have appreciated our decision. We are still continuing some discussions with them.

On the 20/3/79 eight students left Maputo for Dar es Salaam. Among them, two have impregnated two girls here in Maputo. One of the two by the name of Osborne Dladla wants to marry the girl. Find herein enclosed a letter he has written to you informing you of his situation and in a way applying for marriage. Thabo Mofokeng, the second one will write to you from Tanzania about his situation.
