MINUTES OF A MEETING HELD AT THE ANC LAWYER'S OFFICE ON THE 16TH SEPTEMBER, 1992.

Present: Japhet M. Ndlovu, Chief Rep, George Naicker - Treasury, Aziz Adams - ANC Lawyer, and Xolani Mankayi Secretary.

Agenda: Planing to approach KK on non payment by his son
Introducing Mr Maine to ANC Lawyer.

It was felt that the issue of ANC properties in the hands of the UNIP must be tackled in a proper manner as not to embarrass anyone. that the issue is very difficult because soem agreements were entered into at the high levels. That the matter was also discussed thoroughly with ANC President whilst he was here.

That it will be better if the matter is to be approached on two different levels.

1. That KK should be approached since the person involved is his son.
2. That on the question of UNIP, KK should also be approached before he steps down as UNIP President.

It was then agreed that a meeting should be arranged with KK the following Wednesday at 18:30 hours.

It was also revealed that the son to KK was persuaded to opt for any other structure either than the DIA since there are some people who are interested in DIA. Moreso that the interested party should like to use it as executive offices.

On the question of the Museum it was revealed that President and the delegation where briefed and they raised some concern about its maintainance as the ANC does not have funds.

That the Chief Rep explained to them that the venture will be taken care of by the Zambian Tourismboard and other sponsors.

It was then agreed that all matters pertaining to the Museum from hence forth will be handled by the lawyer (Mr Adams) and the Managing Director of PALESA, Mr Maine.

That after the design and valuation of the museum them it will be transfered to Luthuli Foundation - since it will be a non profit making venture.

Some concerns were raised about the behaviour of the present tenant who has on his own decided to change the appearance of the office. Comrade George Naicker was then told to contact the tenant and brief him about the situation.

Also discussed was the issue of landlords who were swindled wall-fence monies by the people who were responsible for housing affairs. That there is no other option but but the landlord must be payed their K6.000 as there is no chance winning in court.
