## BACHANA MATTHEWS MOKOENA

Bachana Matthews Mokoena was born on 26 October 1954 in Ladv Seltiourne, Fretoria. He was the sixth child of the late Mr Job Simon Mokoena and Mrs Frada Malebo Mokoena.

After finishing his oarly education at Mamanwiina Primary School he procasded to Rantailane Secondary School and went on to matriculate at Hebron Training College, outside Pretoria. Hb than pursued a BComm degrso at the University of the North but could not complete this due to political harassment. He left Turf loop to take up a post as a private teacher at Rantailane Secondary.

It was during this period, in the late seventies, that he became instrumental-in the formation of the Human Rights Congress (HRC), which was subsequently banned. His active role? in the HRC led to his detention, along with other HRC leaders, and torture by the Bnphnthatswsna police. On his release in 1978 he escaped to Botswana to avoid further arrest.

In Botswana, cde Bachana continued teaching in a private school. Towards the end of 1981 he married Miriam# who had left the country with him in 1978. They are blessed with two children, Marumo (11 years) and Refiioa (10 years).

Towards the end of the seventies, cde Bachana, together with veteran cultural activists such as cde Wally Serote, Prof Keorapetse Kgositsile, Mandla Langa, the late Thami Mnyale and others founded the Medu Cultural Group. This proved vary successful in promoting ' the active involvement of cultural workers in the struggle for national liberation» It was Medu which organised the historic "Culture for Resistance" conference in Gaborone, Botswana, in 1982.

Due to his unquestionable dedication to the? revolutionary J;. struggl «"cda B «ch#ni left G\*boron» to undergo military training in Angola and became a member of Umkhonto we Sizwe. Cn completion of

his basic military preparation, he was called to serve inthe ANC Department of Arts and Culture (DAC). He travelled extensively with the ANC's Amandls Cultural Ensemble as its official^spokesperson on many of its trail biasing tours abroad.

His ability as an organiser also^aw hxm assigned the .additional task of helping the structures in'charge of servicing .units,'--both in the front areas as well as inside the country. 3'

During his term of service in the DAC, cde Bachana also found time to write several articles on culture and an anthology of poems. It was his dream to see this anthology published.

Bachana Mokoena was a person of boundless energy and several inclinations. He was an avid reader, a keen l&zz. fan and a tireless organiser, On "top of this he was devoted to the discipline

at commerce and accounting. As a resul;t' of .'this he was .invited to serve oi> the ANC's National Fundraising Committee in the of fire of the Treasurer General.

At the 1967 ANC Youth Section Conference in Tanzania,, cds Bachana was elected to the National Youth Secretariat to serve as the Secretary for Finance and Projects, a position he held until his. inclusion in the Task Force that was cresled to take charge of the process of re-establishing the ANC Youth League inside the country. He returned to South Africa on a temporary clearance permit in October 1990.

As the Secretary for Finance and Projects in the Provisional National Youth Committee, cde Bachana aquitted himself diligently. He has a special love for the people and had every confidence in the ability of all, our youth to carry the struggle forward. He lived and died for us all on that fateful day, February 17. As a promising poet, he would agree emphatically with Bertolt Brecht:

"A victory on every page

Who cooked the fsast?

A great man every decade Who paid the bills'5
