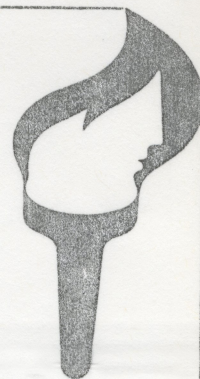

Dear Mr. Tambo,


We have not met for a long time but Inonge and I follow all the developments and tribulations with more than a keen personal interest. Be assured that we are with you in everything that is taking place at home.
