



BACKGROUND DO THE TEXTILE PRINTING WORKSHOP.

The workshop is a pilot project of the Dakawa Cultural Centre and as such one of it's modules.

Dakawa Cultural Centre.

The D.C.C. is conceived as a model. It will be developed as an example for future cultural community centres in a liberated South Africa, and in Dakawa it will fulfill the role of a much needed community centre for the settlement. Simultaneously, the centre must also act as a m means and instrument of achieving a free South Africa, as part of the broad A.N.C. programme of dadre development, which necessarily includes cultural administration as well as the production art and craft commodities. Therefore the centre is intended to fulfill a TRAINING and PRODUCTION function.

Not least of the deprivations of the Apartheid system is that black South Africans have not been given the opportunity to develop, particularly in the technical field of performing, visual and literary disciplines.

When the centre is functioning fully it will develop a core of cultural workers who can, in post apartheid South Africa, play the role of establishing a cultural infrastructure and carrying out of training country wide.

mextile printing workshop:

Cognisant of the broadness of the project, we have decided to undertake it in phases. Phase one is the Theatre Complex and the Textile Workshop.

Two students received their training in Sweden from October 1986- April 1987, at the studio of 1 Ms Malin Sellman, a Swedish artist in Gothenberg. They were sponsored by the S.I.D.A. Educational Division. On their return to Tanzania they set up the workshop in temporary premisis, which was the second stage of the five stage plan of the textile workshop. The third stage was the equiping of the same which was followed by the taking in of other students for the same course, but in Dakawa this time.

Presently we have seven students who are still going through the basic technics of printing, and who for their practicals are printing the designs of the two first students which are in high demand in Sweden following a very successfull traveling exhibition in that country.
