 SINCE June last year  
 thousands of shotguns  
 haw np rently been se-  
 cretly s 1 ed to a mys-

terlous outh African  
port.

The Saturday Star Is in  
possession of a copy of a  
shipping docket which re-  
veals information regard-  
ing the export of thou-  
sands of shot-  
guns to South Africa. But  
the docket does not show  
which port the guns  
were to be shipped  
through

The docket was for-  
warded to the Saturday  
Star by an Indian human  
rights docket. It

has an activist who has  
connections with Ameri-  
can and anti-apartheid move-  
ments.

New York is given as  
the port of origin and ships  
named are the Rowan-  
bank and the Infanta. It

docket is 18 August 1990,

since June last year.

The US Department of  
Commerce in Washington  
recently admitted that it  
was investigating allega-  
tions that thousands of

A spokesman said they  
are investigating the pos-  
sibility that shotguns that  
were apparently shipped  
through Cape Town. ap-  
parently bound for Zim-  
babwe and Namibia. had  
remained in South Africa.

were first raised with the  
department about 11  
months ago and they  
were investigating.
