conferences.

The Conference is also timed to coincide with the hundredth anniversary of the First Hague International Peace Conference.

The Conference will bring together a wide range of initiatives, citizens and organizations to develop substantive global strategies for the reduction of conflict and the peaceful settlement of disputes.

The Conference will address the same three issues that were set at the first International Peace Conference
