Upgrading Makeni Premises Phase II

I refer to Ms. Canonica's letter dated 25 October 1991. I am pleased to inform you that the surveyor of ZAL Holdings has examined the quotation of Damelin Contractors and has found it to be acceptable. The total cost of the additional works proposed will amount to ZK2,775,160 equivalent to US\$ 34,689.50 (excluding fencing)

Fencing of the area surrounding the buildings unfortunately cannot be envisaged as the budgetary provision is not sufficient to cover such a large expenditure. Indeed an area of 60x40m surrounded by a 150mm brick wall would cost ZK900,000; the same area fenced in with a diamond mesh fence would still cost ZK700,000.

Before authorizing us to award the contract however, our Headquarters would like to receive confirmation of the discussions my Deputy, Ms. A.M. Canonica had with you and Mr. Mlangeni of the National Executive Committee on 19 September 1991. They would also like to have additional information concerning:

- exact number of students you plan to accommodate in the upgraded buildings specifying name, age, sex; institution of learning; field of study;
- period during which the students will be accommodated at Makeni;
- arrangements for the transport of students to their respective places of learning.

Considering that UNHCR has already spent ZK1,394,410 equivalent to US\$ 21,843.32 for the initial rehabilitation of Makeni, and would be investing a further ZK2,775,160 equivalent to US\$ 34,689.59, our Headquarters would also like to know if the ANC will consider making these premises available for other refugee programmes in the future.

Hoping to hear from you soon on the issues raised, we remain,
