In 1959 she was elected President of the Union and national Vice President of Women's League of ANC. Same year she was banished and sent immediately to Lesotho with her eleven children. u

Xxg/ Congress of the People in Kliptown. Active in trade union and political struggles throughout the 50's and 60's. Organizer of Food and Canning Workers' Union. Banned in 1963 and spent sixteen years restricted to the area of Benoni. Died in October 1979.

JQDB-iabel Balfour: In January 1957 she was elected to National Management Committee of SACTU. In 1958 arrested for organising April 1957 stay (for: 'At Home'. In 1963 she was banned and confined to Roodeport area (5:2?) Mary Moodly: On June 26, 1955 led her delegation of her area to the Jola Hashe; In March 1956 she was elected Secretary General of South African Clothing Workers' Union. In 1954 served on the Transvaal Provincial Executive of AFC. In 1959 represented SACTU at a conference in Geneva. In 1966 became Vice President of SACTU. In 1963 was banned and restricted to Roodeport area where she lived and died in 1977.

Q:E:kate Molale: Died of a Car accident in May 9, 1980. Fought against Soghatown removals in 1954. In 1955 went round the country collecting peoples' demands for the Congress of the People and Freedom Charter. In 1957 was active in organising people for the Alexandra bus boycott. In the 70's represented the AFC at Women's International Democratic Federation in Berlin. Died of a car accident.

(fnghandie Kodise: Returned to SA illegally in 1978; Arrested in 1979 Kvaaj and kept in solitary confinement from October 1979 to April 1983

Sentence to eight years imprisonment and released on April 10 1988. she was banned in 1960. The banning order expired in December 1985. Now helping to run a school for the children in Durban under very difficult conditions.

,wah Florence Mkhize: Provincial organiser of A30 in Durban from 1955 till 1960.

fax Joyce Mashamba: In May 1976 was arrested together with her husband K J and Brought to court in October 1970. On June 28 1977 convicted and sentenced to 5 years imprisonment. She was released in 1982. Detained in 1986. In 1989 embarked on a hunger strike and now released.

73lx Dorothy Nyembe: On March 1984 released from a 15 year sentence. In 1951 charged for Treason with 156 leaders of the Inc. In 1959 was endorsed out of Durban. Banned in 1963 for five years. In 1969 she was sentenced to 15 years imprisonment.

.Ritathanga: In 1964 was banned from trade union activity. In 1969 charged for under Terrorism Act - acquitted and re-arrested with 11 others. In 1976 Rita was again arrested and appeared in court together with her husband, One morning she was told court was adjourned because her husband Lawrence died that morning. She was not allowed to attend her husband's funeral. Rita was one
