Jan Jonker Afrikaner Senior

Secondary School was founded in .

1980 and began to operate in 1981

' at the initiative of the principal V-

M Moland Gariseb and staff of

the A. I. Steenkamp. The aim was.

to properly accommodate the 2000

former A. I. Steenkamp pupils of

standard six and seven who could

not be accommodated by the

school. '

Mr Jansen was appointed to be

the first principal of the school and

has held the position up to date.

The school which started with the

admission of about 250 standard

six and seven pupils, began to grow

every year until' in 1984 when the

junior'ic class was'4' introduced

Today, Jan Jonker Afrikaner

Secondary School has (-a

population of about 600 pupils

' and 29 teachers. 1

Mr Jansen said that the number

of pupils was reduced from 700 to

600 this year because . of the

decentralisation of educational

facilities from the past apartheid

infrastructures. itThe students have

now got an opportunity to enrol in

the schools in which they were not '

allowed to enter during the colonial

era," he noted.

The school, he said, was facing

a lot of problems because it lacked

basic facilities such as an Assembly

Hall which could be used for

academic and social events, and a

sports ground.

The principal claimed that the

pupils of his school had to travel as

far as to the Independence Stadium

in order to do their sports activities adding that it was very expensive for a developing school like theirs. iiWehave to pay R132 per pupil which amounts to over R60 per occasion plus the cost of stadium facilities?

Mr J ansen explained that though the school had a library and two laboratories, they were not well equipped - with books and ' experimental materials which could provide Students with knowledge and skills. .

The biggest problem, the principal noted, was the lack of hostel facilities. He explained that most of the pupils were from low income families such as labourers ' and domestic servants who lived in smallhouses and poor environment which was not conducive to the childrenis studies.

The only solution to the problem is to build a hostel for the children which would cater for their food and make their studies environment convenient? he said".

'MrJansen observed thatinorder to produce well-educated future leaders, there was a need for a _ continuous upgrading of teachers saying that he appreciated the move to replace Afrikaans with English as the' medium of instruction. He noted the international character of English and said, it would open doors to students.
