The students had been ex-:luded from their trial when witnesses were called in to give evidence against them, which they said was 11an elementary rule of natural justice , the faculty board said in its letter.

The board, agreed with the petition by university students at the beginning of the third term in September which said that the SDC did not have a quorum at certain stages of its proceedings.

The other procedural irregularity alleged by the law faculty is that the students were denied legal representation to which they were entitled. All inlall, the above procedural irregularities render the decision of the SDC to recommend your expulsion clearly invalid.

"The faculty is thus egtitled to treat the expulsion of the students as a legal nullity and will proceed to act accordinglyf the faculty board said.

It also said that it\_ would not be party to such breaches of the law. Dean of the Faculty of Law Mr Kempton Makamure said yesterday the case of the students expulsion was before the High Court and until the hearing he, could not comment.

He admitted that the faculty had been in communication with the university authorities on the issue, but he refused to reveal any details saying it was privileged communication.

Mr Makamure said the issue was a delicate one and he did not want to prejudice the students. nThe forthcoming decision by the court would decide what constituted a fair trial in the Courts of Zimbabwe," he added.

The letter to the students was copied to the Vice-Chancellor and the Academic Registrar.

The three Students Representative Council leaders who were expelled at the-beginning of the last term of the academic year are Paul Chimhosva, Tawanda Mutasa and, Martin Dhina.
