Sir

Thank you for the acknowledgment of receipt of your letter P.M. 100/7/180 of 4 December 1940, reply to which has been delayed by my absence from home.

I am glad to hear that your department for being ready to arrange for the remittance to Ernest Mancoba in occupied France.

Mr Ernest Mancoba is a Union national, he and his ancestors for some way back having been born in what is now the Union of South Africa. He is a King of the race.

I regret that I do not know the number date and place of issue of his passport. But I am making enquiries and will send you the information if it is available.

In the meantime I would state that Mr Mancoba can scarcely fail to be in necessitous circumstances. He is an Art Student and therefore had no chance of earning money his expenses being paid by friends in this country.

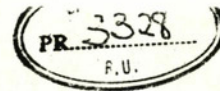


