Short-term Research Training Attachments

 The RESA project, which is located in the Sociology Department, University of Essex, is able to offer a number of short-term (normally 4 to 9 months) research training attachments.

2. Aims of Training Attachments

The purpose of these attachments is to provide opportunities, for South Africans researching and writing in the sphere of education, to develop or enhance their skills in respect of:

- a. theoretical and analytical work
- research methods (primarily in library, archival and documentary empirical research)
- c. writing up of research reports, articles and so forth.

3. The Organisation of the Training Programmes

The training programmes will be tailored to the particular research interests of and needs of each individual attached to RESA and will be so arranged as to enable materials relevant to different research topics to be collected.

However:

- a. Each trainee will work under the supervision of one of the RESA researchers but working papers and reports will be discussed also at seminars consisting of RESA researchers and all those working with RESA on attachment.
- b. Trainees will participate in fortnightly seminars organised by RESA in London for South African postgraduate students and may have the opportunity to present papers on their work to the seminar.
- c. Trainees may be required to attend appropriate postgraduate courses at the University of Essex.

4. Basis of Selection of Trainees

- While it is expected that applicants will normally have a post-matric qualification, considerable weight will be given to applicants' experience and capacity to study on their own.
- RESA training programmes are principally intended to contribute to the development of black South African intellectuals and, in particular African intellectuals and this will weigh heavily in the selection of redmin de de trainees.

5. Costs of Attachment

Where possible applicants should obtain travel and subsistence from funding agencies, their orgnisations or institutions.

- b. In appropriate cases RESA will contribute all or a part of the trainees subsistence and travel costs.
- Research expenses during the currency of an attachment will be met by RESA.

Applications

- Applications for the 1989 1990 academic year (October 1989 to June 1990) must be submitted by not later than June 30th 1989.
- b. Letters of application must be accompanied by:
- i. Up to date Curriculum Vitae. " "
 - ii. Copies of academic certificates.
 - iii. Brief statement of research topic.
 - Copies of, at least, one piece of work or essay written in a course of study, research or employment.
 - Name and address of two referees
 - vi. A letter from an appropriate body recommending the attachment.
