ANC MEDIA STATEMENT ON THE MURDER OF REGGIE HADEBE

The National Working Committee of the ANC learnt with shock and outrage of the murder of Regional Executive Committee member and media officer of the Natal Midlands Region of the ANC, Mr Reggie Hadebe. The vehicle he was travelling in with another prominent member of the ANC Regional Executive in the Natal Midlands, Mr Shakes Cele, and lawyer Mr John Jeffries was ambushed on the Richmond-Ixopo road.

The ANC will leave no stone unturned in an effort to bring the murderers to book. The ANC finds a direct relationship between the murder of Mr Hadebe and the propaganda that violence in Natal and elsewhere in the country will be primarily solved by a meeting between the leaders of the ANC and the IFP. The ANC is of the view that a meeting of all the signatories to the Peace Accord, is the best way to revive the Peace Accord. The ANC is therefore, going to work towards a meeting of all the signatories to the Peace Accord.

Cdes Reggie Hadebe and Shakes Cele and Attorney John Jeffreis attended a Peace Meeting in the Ixopo area this morning. The meeting was attended by the Police, Chief Diamini, a minister from Ulundi, and Chief Xawulengwe Mkhize who faces a number of murder charges. Chief Diamini refused to allow the meeting to proceed on the pretext that a number of chiefs were not present. There is reason to believe that the time the ANC delegation used in Ixopo trying to persuade Chief Diamini to allow the meeting to proceed was to prepare for their ambush.

We appeal to the people of Natal to exercise restraint and discipline at this time of extreme provocation. All our people must bear in mind that many of those who shed copious crocodile tears at the carnage in the province provoke violence in many ways in the hope that they will make us annihilate each other while they continue to pretend to be above the babarism of their creation. This is a trap we must avoid whatever the provocation.

The National Working Committee conveys its deepest condolences to the bereaved family and friends of Reggie Hadebe.

ANC PRESS STATEMENT ON PIK BOTHA'S CALL FOR CODESA TO GO

The African National Congress is determined that the negotiation process move forward with maximum speed to elections for a Constituent Assembly, as already agreed in the Record of Understanding with the National Party.

The Codesa forum is one that is inclusive, whereby all organisations, irrespective of size or proven support, are free to participate fully and equally in deliberations to chart the way forward.

The statement by Pik Botha, after the bilateral meeting with the PAC in Gaborone, that Codesa must go to make way for a more representative forum, is another blatant attempt to delay, if not completely stail, the process.
