history and current affairs.

If he does so he will find that the Treaty of Waitangi, signed in 1840, guaranteed Maoris

New Zealand also had its first Maori Prime Minister back in the late 1880s — Sir James Carroll. Also, the Maoris have always had parliamentary representation.

Today, it is far easier for a Maori than a pakeha (white face) to get funding for housing and education. Also 50% of Maori marriages are to the dreaded pakeha.

All New Zealand official welcomes for overseas people are based on the Maori welcome. Not to mention the All Blacks always performing the haka (war dance) while on tour.

One day perhaps the country will be called by its rightful name, *Aoteoroa* (the land of the long white cloud), not some Dutch bastardisation There is no denying that there is some racial friction there, particularly over land rights, but that can only be expected in any community anywhere — although it should not be condoned.
