The poet ihcidentally is PABLO NERUDA a son of the Chilean people and one of the greatest poets produced by this century. Neruda's funeral 1h 1973 was the first public demonsration against the fascist dictatorship. The current strike has been called by opponents of the dictatorship to protest agaist continued repression. CHILE, with 30% of the workforce unemployed, 12 years of the most uhhuman repression and a huge unpayable foreign debt is without doubt in the threshold of social changes. In 1970 the Popular Unity government of Salvador Allende was voted into power. It curtailed the activities of the north American "dhonopolies, introduced progressive socio-economic changes and e f exercised a progressive foreign policy. These developments were ' go the distaste of such powerful monopolies as the United Fruit Company of the USA. The Military which up to then had played the role of defending the donstitution was infiltrated by the CIA and suddenly: " ... One morning all that was hurting .0. One morning bonfires Leapt out of the earth Devouring human beings And from then on' FARE JWPOLUD ER FRCM Then DN-And from then on blood 1- -u..-. 'aew The constitutionally elected President Salvador Allende was killed

The constitutionally elected President Salvador Allende was killed in LA MONEDA PALACE defending the Republic with a rifle given to him as a present by FIDEL CASTRO. Shortly before his death he refused the opportunity to flee by aircraft and chose to be with his people during their tragedy.

From 1973 an upreeedented vicious repression in the country's history was unleashed on the people. People disappeared in thousands and the Jails couldn't accomodate all the victims of the dictatorship The huge stadium in SANTIAGO wag used to incercerate the best sons

and daughters of CEILEC Death Squea, this inevitable product of Tyranny assasinated oppanents of the dictatorship.

Presently thousands of people have disappearedw The death squads invoke sad memories about the murder of such redoubthble. Opponents of apartheid as Griffiths & Victoria Mxenge, Matthew Gorlwe Sparrow Mhhonto and many othersa This is no mere concidence for the white minority regime enjoys intimate contacts with the generals in Chileo

It would however be no unfounded optimism on our side when we irrevocebly state that democracy will return to Chile. In the course of a short period of time Latin America has witnessed the demise of bloody military regimes. After twenty years of right wing militnwx repression Brazillians were able to vote for civillians. This state of affairs was not brought by any tenevolence on thepart of the military whose P:?nanagement of the economy led to Brazil having the hugest foreign debto There strike action by workers precipitated the capitalation of the military. In 1982 Bolivia fdr whose freednmr Che Guevara sacrificephis life changed over to the parliamentary system.

This was the case with other latin american states like Argentina in 1983. The Argentinians went even further by instituting criminal charges against the former tyrants. As recent as January 1986 Guatemala elected a civilian leader after having its last progressive government of Arbenz drowned in blood in 1953.

Presently Chile and Paraguay are still under reactionary military regimes. If the fighting traditions of the LATIN American people trditions embodied in such personalities as SIMON BOLIVAR, JOSE MARTI SANDING, CHE Guevara and many others, are anything to go by then we should be very much justified in saying to these treacherous generals "...From every crime bullets are born

The bullls eye of your heart".
