Bheki Mlangani was killed by a high technology assassination device implanted in the earphone# of s. Walkman at about \$. iQpjn last night.

Bhexi Mlangeni was a candidate attorney at cheadle Thompson & Haysora. A& such he had been predominantly involved in investigating the &otiviti «a of hit squad*, the CCB and the clandestine operations at Vlakplaas. Hg a member of the

legal tea® representing the Independent 3oard of Inquiry into Informal Repression at the Harms Commission both in London and Pretoria. During the Commission he received a death threat arising out of his work.

Sfceki Mlangani had been a candidate attorney for two years, and was about to write his attorney's admission exams this month.

He was highly regarded by his colleagues both ae a professional lawyer and as a colleague. He had recently been invited to join our permanent professional staff. He wac enormously i-;pular amongst coileagues, clients and staff, generous with hie time, courageous in his political and professional life, courteous and

Bhaki was, netwithstandincf' hit* youth, regarded *» a community leader of the highest calibre. Ha was the AMC Jabulani Branch Chairman. He wa* a foraar atudant leader at Fort Karo and wits Univex*sities. At an activist he had been detained for lengthy period* on three occasion*. He was deeply involved in civic issues as education officer for the Soweto Civic Association.

He watt married to iJap&ti and leave* a ion, Mandla, aged two. He supported hie threa brothers, a sister and hiss parent*, Bheki came from a poor and honest worJcing-class background, When asked if hia father was proud of hie professional achievement Bhaki would reply simply and sincerely 'Â¥**, bat not as proud as X am of my father'.

Bheki'a death is a true Ices to the New South Africa. He uniquely embodied the new non-racial future not only by virtue, of the work he performed daily but also in his ordinary every day dealings with the people around him, old and young, black and white, rich and poor.

Bheki Ml&nger.i was a lawyer involved in the exposure of assassination squads. To kill lawyers is to attack the legal system. To kill lawyers who puraue justice is to destroy achievement of justice itself. Bheki'a daath only underlines the importances of continuing with the work in which he was involved.

8 Bhaki Mlangeni collected the parcel from his pigeon hole at Cheadle Thompson & H&ysom and took the parcel homer leaving the wrapping at the office, His wife 8tar.es that he took the' Walkman and its tape into his room and shortly thereafter there was an explosion. Family members rushed to the scans* and found him dead with severe injuries to the head.

The Board believes that this i* the work of an extremely sophisticated assassin. The fact that the parcel was pasted in South Africa and intended for Dirk Coerces suggestA© that Coetsee was the intended target. For some reason it never reached him and was eventually returned to the address marked on the parcel. Bheki Mlangeni was, during thA© Harms Commission, in regular contact with Coetzee, persons monitoring Mlangeni and Coetsee's conversations would have bean aware of Mlangeni's first name out not necessarily his surname, in fact, in early April 1390 Bheki Mlangeni received an anonymous telephone call stating that a "hit squad" had been despatched to kill Dirk Coetzee in Zambia. It appears therefore that one month betoro the parcel was sent to Coetzee unknown persons were aware that Bheki Mlangeni was in contact with Coetzee. This was confirmed in writing in a letter dated 9 April 1930 to the Secretary of the commission. A copy of that letter ia attached. Obviously Bheki Mlangeni who who liaising with Coetzee would never have Bent a bomo to kill Coetzee. But the assassin clearly took advantage of the working relationship between Bheki Mlangeni and
