2.0. REPORT FROM BRAZZAVILLE

The Regional and Assistant Regional Director were not in Brazzaville for the meeting. W.H.O. people present were not quite articulate nor fully briefed.

- 2.2. On Venue: The regional director had written to Zimbabwe and other centres (countries) but has not yet received any reply. Comrade Manto further reported that she has written to our Chief Rep in Zimbabwe to see the Zimbabwean authorities to urge them to reply.
- 2.3. As the task of this prepartory meeting was to look into the papers, the Regional director advised the meeting to produce Working Papers rather than Position papers as initially agreed upon.
- 2.4. All our papers had to be redone as follows:-
 - Health Action Paper turned out to have been done only by as and accepted as the basis for the final version.
 - Child Health: done by the O.A.U. was not satisfactory and we had to re do it, combining it with our own paper on Maternal Health.
 - Workers Health: by SMAPO. Not enough was done on the paper by SWAPO. We had to extract from our position paper sections dealing with Worker's Health to do worker's health with SWAPO.
 - Health and Liberation: Still to be done by one of the newly independent African States.
- 2.5. The last preparatory meeting for the conference is to be held in Accra in September at tje Regional Committee Meeting.

- 2.6. On Invitations: The issue of specialists to be invited will be discussed at the Regional Meeting.
- 2.7. Comrade Manto reported that we still have to give in additional names of people to be invited. We had prepared a list of support groups, not of individuals. Comrade Peter Mfelang has sent a name of a doctor who is interested in the meeting. And there are further requests from 2 American women to be invited.

- 2.8. The meeting agreed that Comrade Manto should write to the Chief Rep in London, Canada, U.S.A. and Scandnavian countries for them to send list of all South African Health personnel that can be invited to the conference. We do not promise tickets, it would be best if they support themselves.
- 2.9. In reply to a question on how many delegates are expected from us,

 Comrade Manto replied that the decision depends on the Regional Director.

 We had requested one person for each commission. There are likely to

 be five papers menaing we would have five tickets which would be

 distributed in the Southern Africa region.

3.0. A.N.C. PARTICIPATION

- 3.1. As we hope to hold our next Health Council Meeting at the Conference we need to have the maximum number of people attending, Comrade Manto is therefore to try and find extra funds from support groups.
- 3.2. The Question of publications to be distributed at the conference, Comrade Manto reported that she had already consulted with the DIP.
 - 3.3. On Material from home, the R.C. is to be given themes of the conference so that they can decide on what will be relevant at the conference.
 - 3.4. Comrade Amo is to look into the question of Amandla cloth material being ready for the conference. If not available it should be requisitioned.
 - 3.5. Comrade Manto will keep the Lusaka Health Team, presently acting as the conference preparatory Committee from Brazzaville.

4.0. OTHER MATTERS

After consultation with the Lusaka Team's Chairman the name of Comrade Mayford was sugested and duly sent as our delegate. However it transpired that Comrade Mayford has to leave for further studies.
