- 1.0. Minutes of the previous meeding were read and adopted.
- 1.1. Suggested that the administration in Dakawa shoul be approached with a view to have Cde Zakhele Sihiya attached to SOMAFCO while awaiting scholarhsip.

- 1.3..1 Perried that the
- 1.3.1. Reported that the three stude ts admitted for studies in Ethiopia would be soponsored by the African-American Institute.
- 1.3.2. There was no scholarship yet for the other two.
- 1.4 Reported that Cde Sibusiso Nxumalo was still to see vice-Principal of SOMAFCO for an assessment test.

- 1.5.1. Alleged that the NSC has applied for more students to study in capitalist countries than in socialist countries. This was not subtantiated.
- 1.5.2. Reported that the mojority of our students have been applied for studies in socialist countries.
- 1.5.3. It was explained that it was next to impossible to re-apply for withdrawn/expelled students to study in socialist countries. The same applies to those of a certain age group viz, over 30. These are usually applied for studies elsewhere.
- 1.6 As regards Nomonde Mtambo, the NSC still awaited the response of the Chief Rep. in Canada concerning funding for her.
- 1.7 Agreed to write to the South African Extension Unit (SAEU) as regards funding for correspondence courses.
- 1.8 Agreed that unsuccessful candidates should be informed that their applications had been rejected by institutions/ sponsors.
- 1.9 Suggested that wheever possible, students should be counselled to apply for full-time study.
- 1.10 To write to the Bulgarian Embassy informing them that Peter Mabandla was unavailable for scholarship.

- 2.2.1 Noted letters from the Administrative Secretary
 (Education) to the UNDP and African Literature Centre
 for funding and admission respectively.
- 2.2.2 Agreed that he should be advised to desist from processing scholarship applications as this is the responsibility of the NSC.
- 2.3 To ask the Chief Representative in Luanda to explain why he facilitated the applications of two students to study in Ghana, without reference to the NSC.

- 3.1.1 Reported that students in Ethiopia on the African
 American Institute (AAI) scholarships were experiencing
 difficulties, for
 - i) their allowances were not enough
 - ii) payment of the allowances was irregular

- 3.1.2. In response to the above, it was reported that the NSC had redeived no complaint from either the Chief Representative or AAI scholarship holders.
- 3.1.3.1 Agreed that the Chief Kepresentative sholud write a report to the NSC detailing grievances.
- 3.1.3.2 The report would provide grounds on which a complaint would be lodged with the AAI.
