The Secretsry for Education regretted that the Women's Section and the Youth Section still felt thut they had the right to place candidates as separate bodies, whereas that was the sole responsibility of the NSC.

As regards funding for studies by correspondence, the Secretary for Education advised the utilisation of the Luthuli Cultural and Welfare Services.

He reported willing to intervene whenever there were difficulties with that Organisation.
