1.1. The Chairman welcomed the Secretary For I'Jdu.ca;tion and briefly explained the purpose of the meeting. This was to clarify certain matters.

2.1. Placements b HQ

2.1.1. The Secretary for Education explained such placements case by case:

i) Sundile Motswenyane: the head of Agriculture in the T-G's Office seized the opportunity to place him and there was no time to follow normal procedures for placement.

. ii) Maleboge Machele: to be placed, follow up about her placement.

iii) Zukise Tshabalela: the NSC having had no time to recommend for the French Course, she being a secondary school graduate with nothing to do, was placed for the course.

iv) The Graup for the EEG - Edmund Khozu, Mabutho Msimung and Kenneth Gomotso: time was running out; OBS had places.

2.1.2. The Secretary for Education said that there had to be an established procedure for awarding scholarships.

2.1.3. He further asserted that there would be no scholarship awarded unless done through the NSC. 1%

2.1.4. He reiterated the rule that for candidates attached to departments scholarship placement would have to have written approval of the head of department.

2.1.5. He reaffirmed that application forms which are not properly filled in should be returned to applicants.

2.1.6. He proposed procedure with which the Committee concurred, that

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1) the DMD must be involved to help identify whether the course applied for is within the range of priorities of the Movement:

- that all applications for scholarship placement emanating from within East Africa would be submitted directly to the NSC and, in consultation with the Representative of the DMD, they would be processed;

- that all applications for scholarship placement emanating from all areas outside East Africa would be henceforth channelled through the Department of Education, to be passed on to the NSC after consultation with the DMD; - - ;

ii) the Education Officer would only place candidates as a member of the NSC and through the NSC; ;

iii) the NSC would decide which funding agency to utilise;

iv) all party school applications would be handled by the DMD;

v) the Gavan Mbeki Fellowship was the responsibility of the NSC.

vi) regarding placement for ILO placements/fellowships, it was a little complicated since it involved the T-G's Office which has a responsibility for the Movement's projects.

The Secretary for Education felt that as an administrative convenience it was for the NSC to decide on the setting up of a secretariat.

It was agreed that applicants coming to Dakuwa before going on scholarship, would have their transport cost paid for with funds raised in areas where they lived.

The Secretary for Education regretted that the Women's Section and the Youth Section still felt that they had the right to place candidates as separate bodies, whereas that was the sole responsibility of the NSC.

As regards funding for studies by correspondence, the Secretary for Education advised the utilisation of the Luthuli Cultural and Welfare Services.

He reported willing to intervene whenever there were difficulties with that Organisation.
