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BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

SYDNEY KUMALO was born in South Africa in 1936. He studied at the Polly Stree: Ar Centre, Johannesburg. He has had numerous exhibitions in Scuth Africa and is now one of the leading sculptors there.

LOUIS MAOQHUBELA was born in Durban in 1938. He studied at the Pally Street Centre under Cecil Skotnes from 1957 onwards. He has recently completed six murals for the Jubilee Social! Cantre in Johannesburg. In 1959 he won second prize in the Rembrandt Competition. He has exhibited at the Adler Fielding Gafleries. Johannesburg since 7952.

EPHRAIM NGATANE was born in 1938 in Basutoland. His family moved to Johannesburg in 1942. He attended the Rooke Memorial School where he first became interested in painting. He later went to the Orlando High Schacl. In 1952 he went to the Polly Street Centre of Art and studied under Cecil Skotnes. He has exhibited in the Adler Fielding Galleries Artists of Fame and Promise Exhibition since 1960, and has had numerous one-m an

shows in Johannesburg. Cape Town and other cities in South Africa. He is also 3 jazz musician and has his own hand.

ANDREW MCOTJUOADI was born in a tribal area in Northern Transvaal in 1935. but has lived in the Mamelodi area since he was two years old. His drawings have appeared im the

Adler Fielding Galleries Artists of Fame and Promise Exhibitions since 1963. He was commissioned last year to do drawangs for the Cornel Wilde film * The Naked Preyâ\200 $\234$. Several

ra have appeared about Motjuoadi, notably one by Julian Beinart in the magazine \hat{a} 200\234 Classic \hat{a} 200\234.

LUCAS SITHOLE was originally a house painter. He is not prolific but a number of South African Collectors such as Mrs. Harry Oppenheimer and the Schlesinger Organisation have bought his werk. He has shown on a number of occasions in the Artisis of Fame and Pramise Exhibition and various mixed exhibitions at the Adler Fielding Galleries.

GERARD SEKOTO was born at a mission station near Middleburg. Transvaal in 1913. He is a self-taught artist of the Pedi people. He was trained as a teacher and taught for a few

years before becoming a professional artist. He has had several one-man shows in South Africa and is probably one of the best known African painters. His works hang in The Jchannesburg Art Gallery. He is now painting in Paris where he has been for 2 number of years.
