

REPORT ON ACTIVITIES IN HARARE 01 - 0 .0 .8

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1. Enroute to Dar es Salaam, we made a stop-over in Harare. It will be recalled that then we were from a PMC meeting in Lusaka.

2. Comrade Roy Campbell (Mhthatha) was met. He has a few problems. In discussing with him, we felt it would be better to present his case to the Chief Representative, rather than to his sponsors. Ode. Roy is doing a course on Rehabilitation in Harare under the sponsorship of ILO. Because of the high cost of living Ode. Roy requests for assistance, which we endorse.

2.1. He needs an English Dictionary and Anatomy Book. These items are essential for his studies.

2.2. We advised him to hand in his travel document to the office in June 1984, so that it can be sent to Dar fer renewal.

2.3. Cde. Roy will as from now, at convenient hours, run a clinic for our comrades in Harare. A health team nucleus has now been set up in Harare. The first meeting is being arranged. We approached some health personnel. The proposed personnel are cdes. Roy, Smangele, Sophie, Luthuli, Fezeka

3. VISIT TO THE SCHOOL OF SOCIAL WORK

This was at the instance of Dr. Zotovio, the Director of the Rehabilitation Course, 53 which Cde. Roy is also a student in Harare. k

3.1. This course will properly be repeated next year. A B.Sc degree on Social Work will be offered as well. It will also be run by ILO. Candidates must have some basic Social Work Certificate and experience. This will be a three year course.

3.2. Should the organisation , not have such qualifying candidates, then there maybe consideration of enrolling one with education qualifications. This is a matter to be sorted out with the University.

3.3. A nurse with tutorship experience will also be considered. We suggest h4re the name of Cde. nggile Ntuli. The ground work has been done. we need to ab 3 quick follow-up, by sending her certificates, her C.V. and a covering letter, requesting the University formally to accept her for the course. The usual channels need to be followed. The course starts in January, 1985.

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Next Year, 1L0 will also run a course on "EROTHESES" and all the related questions. Once more the ANC will be invited to send participants; preferably disabled participants. The course will start in march, 1985.

Dr. Zotovic advised us to work out the needs of the course, which Ode. Roy will be expected to run after completion of this course. The course is assured financial and material support.

RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH

1. That the course be run in Angola, preferably in collaboration with SWAPO. The course is designed to run for six months.

2. That thought be given to widen the scope of the Department of Health and call it the Department of Health and Social Welfare.

The Chief Representative in Harare will make a follow-up of all matters referred to above.

Dr. Zotovic will, through his organisation in Yugoslavia arrange for some of our people who need protheeee to go there. This however, might take sometime. There is need therefere to keep fluid contact with Dr. Zotovic.

Dr. Zotovic praised Cde. Roy Campbell as a conscientious, hard-working student, who always asks relevant and challenging questions. Through him they have come to appreciate clearer the dimension and magnitude of our problems.

The Principal Father Rogers of the school of Social Work was also met. A detailed discussion was held on the role of Social Workers, rehabilitative services entrance qualifications for a Diploma in Social Work, as well as for the B.Sc Social Work. He could assist us in obtaining fellowships from the South African Council of Churches.

During these discussens, both Dr. Zotovic and Father Rogers requested us to travel to Harare to give some lectures on Rehabilitation to the group currently doing Rehabilitation of war Victims, Refugees and Migrant Labourers. They also asked us to contribute an article to their magazine, "The African Rehabilitation Journal."

VLSIT TO THE MINISTRY OF SOCIAL WELFARE

The essence of the visit was to request the Ministry to wave the

qualificating requirements for the B. So degree in Social Work
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candidate Lungile Ntuli, who has done community
medicine and therefore would fit into Medical Rehabilitation.

8. The Division in-charge of Refugees was also met. The reception
was warm and friendly. we were informed that there are two
types of refugee camps: '

8.1. The UNHGR, where the militia people stay also. There
are Soth Africans here. Once there was a clash between two
Somehow it has now been resolved. There was need to visit this
camp in order to indentify our group. Mbst people, on arrival
were rather cautioiEZto mention which organisation they belonged to.

8.2. A transit camp, under construction. Even though there
was land to develop and cultivate, South Africans had shown
a negative attitude towards labour.

9. This Division therefore, was of th opinion that the ANC, havin;
identified its peoplelwould assist in the discipline to be main-
tained in these camps. Besides that we would be able to advise
on the best measures to be taken in motivating our people and
also take those whom we thought were the best crop.

10. The #Et meeting was with the South African Women, the supporters
of the ANC. They have promised to collect some panties,
soap and other small items for the girls in Mazimbu.
