Decisions taken at the Meeting of the

Task Force on the Hearings on the Oil Ambargo against South Africa 'held at 3:30 2.m.z Thursday, 2 March 1989

The Task Force, after consultation with the representative of the Department of Public Information, requested that arrangements be made for the Chairman of the Task Force or any of its members to give the briefings - preferably on 10 April 1989 - about commencement of the hearings.

The Task Force requested the representative of DPI to assist in arranging an interview for the United Nations Chronicle and in obtaining accreditation to journalists from outside the United Nations who will be invited to the hearings.

The Chairman informed the Task Force that there will be a press release On the hearings on 3 March 1989.

The Task Force decided that the poster should include: .

"Hearings on the Oil Embargo against South Africa

United Nations

New York

12-13 April 1989

"Do not fuel Agartheid"

The last sentence should prefeiably be in all official languages of the United Nations; and if that is not possible, in English and French. The Task Force authorized the delegations of German Democratic Republic and Norway to explain to the artist, who will design the draft, the ideas behind the hearings in order that they be taken into account in'designing the poster. The TaskForce authorized the aforedentioned delegations to "finalize the brochure taking into consideration the comments made at the meetings.

The Task Force approved the rules of procedure as amended.

The Task Force requested the Vice-Chairman (Ghana) to present a revised text of guidelines taking into consideration the remarks made at the meeting on the draft presented at the meeting.

The Task Force requested the Secretariat to bring to the attention of the 'Chairman of the Intergovernmental Group to Monitor the Supply and Shipping of Oil and Petroleum Products to South Africa and the Special Committee against Agartheid the recommendation to convene a joint meeting to consider the guidelines and the rules of procedure.
