

The people presenting will include at least two speakers from the SADCC conference to take place in Ottawa on May 18/19. They are Stephen Gelb from the University of Durban in Westville and Max Sisulu from the ANC Research Department. It is possible that Salome Moiane, the Deputy Foreign Minister from Mozambique will also be present. Other presenters and discussants being invited will include John Saul, Judith Marshall, Dennis Howlett and Bongile Njube.
