Dear Comrade Maseko:

As you are aware, we have for some time been on a campaign to strengthen the ANC presence in the Carpentry Factory. Part of this process, of course, involves bringing in more ANC cadres. The other side of the coin is that we must ensure that every ANC man there is contributing to the best of his ability; We cannot afford laggards and negative influences. On the whole, the comrades have responded well to our campaign. Unfortunately, there is one exception, and that is Cruise Bowe. His attendance has been extremely irregular for a long time. He has been given a number of responsibilities within the Factory, most recently that of quality control inspector (a key position), and has had to be removed from them due to his erratic behaviour.

This office, the Works Committee, and the Production Unit, have all come to the conclusion that Cruise has been given more than enough chances. We are no longer in a position to tolerate the situation if we hope to continue strengthening that particular collective of workers. The time has come for Cruise to be removed from the Carpentry Factory.

At the same time, in order not to diminish the ANC manpower in the Factory, we would like to bring Thobile Vakaiiza here from Dakawa. He is a mature comrade and an experienced joiner. Since accommodation in Mazimbu is always in short supply, we propose that Cruise be moved to Dakawa, where he will have a chance to prove himself, and that Thobile be given his room in Ilala. The sooner this is implemented, the better. We trust there will be no problems with these proposals.
