Dear Victor;

I had the opportunity today and yesterday to speak to Jabu Dube regarding the ANC's current position on the boycott of South Africa.

As you probably know, the Canadian Federation of Students, and the travel company which we own and operate, Travel CUTS, are currently participating in the boycott. Given the changing situation, it is necessary to update our information.

It is my understanding from speaking with Jabu that the following boycotts have been lifted: sports, culture, academic exchange, and tourism. It is also my understanding that the following boycotts are still in place: trade, financial, investment, oil and resources, military assistance, diplomatic activity.

As you may know, the Federation operates a work exchange programme, the Student Work Abroad Programme. Through this activity, the Federation is a member of an international work exchange organization which is currently considering investigating in 1994 the possibility of establishing work and/or educational exchanges with South Africa. We would like to invite the ANC's comments on how such an activity would be viewed. It is my understanding at the moment that such activity would be permissible under the current terms of the boycott.

Also of interest to our members on this topic is the nature of the South African student population and the student movement. We would not wish to participate in any exchange which was not integrated, and questions have been raised about the participation of the non-white populations in the post-secondary education system, the effect that economic barriers might have on multi-racial participation in any delegation in an exchange visiting Canada, etc. Any information which you could supply on these topics would be most gratefully appreciated.


