### Quarterly Report

The NSC Secretariat (herein <sup>referred</sup> after to as the Secretariat) has prepared its quarterly report which throws light on the extent to which it has or has not been able to implement the decision and recommendations of the NSC regarding the placing of students, graduates and post graduates for study in the necessary institutes of learning.

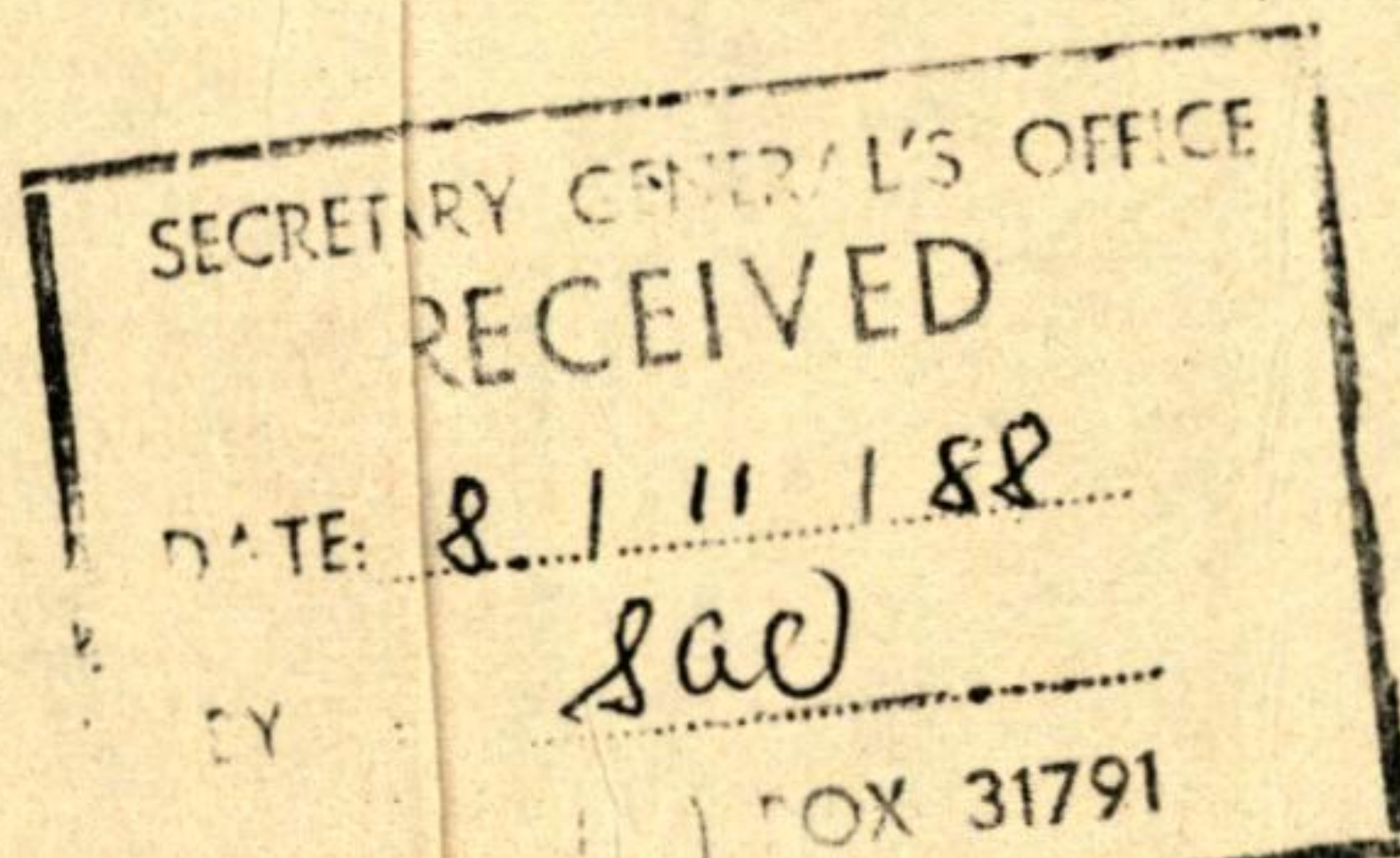
The Secretariat has been able to clarify the position of two Cdes (see referrals, NSC minutes 26.03.88) Dumisani Khoza and Trinity Sibisi. The former has been made able to report at the NSC office thanks to the efforts of the NSC chairperson. His application for scholarship will be filed at the earliest possible opportunity. The letter is reliably reported to have left our region (E. Africa) for the front. His application for scholarship automatically becomes of no consequence.

As required by NSC meeting of April 20 1988, (see 3.6) a circular was prepared/drafted and sent to the DMD and the construction site in Dakawa. So far there has been no response, save oral expressions of interest in the course (or at least some of them) offered by JLO Turin. As required by the NSC, (see 3-2 of the afore-said minutes) over thirty candidates have been identified by the secretariat for access courses. The Secretariat has not been able to contact Bongani Hlazo who needs a recommendation by his department (see 2-2).

Christopher Brown was assessed and advised to join Somafo (which he did with pleasure) (see 2-1) in the minutes. Simphiwe Simpizhi was assessed and found wanting, he was advised to go for primary teacher's course (see minutes of May 4, 1988 under referrals). Reuben Sekgopoi, who wants to study theology was called to discuss and ascertain his choice of field of study with the NSC Chairperson. A satisfactory solution was found during the discussion with the Cde Masondo. Over thirty applicants filled in Southern African Relief Fund forms for sponsorship. The full list in Commonwealth forms and nearly twenty filled in forms from Africa Educational Trust. The above-mentioned refers to the period from the last NSC meeting 4 May 1988 to the forthcoming meeting scheduled for 15 June 88. The secretariat has submitted the names of those candidates most likely to secure sponsorship (due to high grades) to the passport office to initiate application procedures. The Secretariat wishes to appeal directly to departments recommending students or graduates for further study to ensure that their applicants come to the NSC office in Mazimbu in person at the very least once for consultations and such like.

The same applies to individual applicants. Experience has clearly shown that it is extremely difficult for anyone to apply for a scholarship and facilitate that application form from places as far away from the NSC's Mazimbu office as Maputo, Lusaka or Luanda. Even those applicants who stay in Dakawa are not and cannot be expected to travel to the NSC office as regularly as possible. This will remain valid as long as the Secretariat does not acquire its own reliable means of transport that are always and freely at its disposal.

Applicants who have certificates are a particularly heavy burden on the NSC secretariat. The Secretariat, therefore, suggests that practical ways of helping them be found-e.g. issued testimonials





that can be used as certificate by those who have done very well in assessment tests. Another way of coping with this problem is to appeal for more access course offers. This should be done by the Education Dept. of the ANC. This is one more problem facing the secretariat; a situation in which parents of certain applicants (or the applicants themselves) engage in scholarship procurement <sup>cases</sup> without the NSC. When they get them, then (and only then) they approach the secretariat and try to secure admission to institutes of learning. At times they first get themselves admitted, and then expect us to procure fund for them. The secretariat's policy is and should be that all applicants without exception should follow the necessary procedure laid down by the NSC for everybody, irrespective of department or place of residence. The Education Dept. and indeed all other ANC departments should do everything in their power to ensure that the correct procedure is followed without fail.
