As you are aware, there is a move by local white business in particular to move out of the Central Business District of Johannesburg to places like Sandton and Midrand. The rooms are standard, to accommodate two people. However, a person can take the room without sharing if it is so desired. This arrangement is the same in the suites range.

The proposed sight-seeing tours are really designed to enable the participants to visit the outlying areas where our people are and where the need is greatest for continued assistance well into the future. We think our supporters ought to see for themselves at first hand what we mean by the ravages and consequences of Apartheid misrule in our country. We therefore do not anticipate making a charge for this unless people wish to travel outside Johannesburg.


