LOCAL CHIEFS in the  
homelands are rated more  
highly than the homeland  
leaders themselves, accord-  
ing to a survey released at  
the weekend.

The survey â\200\224 conducted in  
four key homelands, the  
Transkei, KwaZulu, Lebowa  
and BophuthaTswana

. found that homeland resi-  
dents were re likely to  
name their local chief ag the  
person they admired most  
than their chief ministers

Taken collectively, ten per  
cent of homeland residents  
named their local chiefs as  
the most admired persons â\200\224  
against -eight per cent for  
Chief Gatsha Buthelezi of  
KwaZulu, four per cent for  
Paramount Chieftain Ma-  
tanzima of the Transkei and  
one per cent each for Dr  
Cedric Pathudi of Lebowa  
and Chief Lucag Ma'ngope of  
BophuthaTswana.

Although Chief Matanzima

It appears to be inconsis- (tent with another of the survey's findings that acceptance of the homelands concept was highest in the Transkei, with nearly three in every four people there in favour of it.

In Lebowa, slightly more than one in every five people knew their Chief Minister's

name (the low score here might be because Dr Pathudi only became Chief Minister last year).

In KwaZulu the ratio was nine in every 10. In Botswana it was slightly lower.

Of the four homeland leaders, Chief Buthelezi was easily the most popular.

He was the only homeland leader hated by people living

in his homeland; indeed, others admitted most. In addition, among the whites:
