This office is in receipt of communication from UNETPSA which speaks for itself, and which we are happy to enclose herewith for your attention and response.

As you will doubtlessly notice from the said correspondence, that UNETPSA is expecting us to provide some clarity on the issues raised. We would therefore be very grateful if you could assist as soon as you can.

I should also like to take this opportunity to recall standing policy with regard to communication between the UN System and ANC structures:

As much as possible, the various structures of the movement should appraise this office on matters being raised with the UN. This is not only dictated by reasons of diplomatic etiquette, but also to enable this office to carry out the requisite follow-up. This, needless to say, also applies to the various ANC missions abroad.

We trust that we can rely on the ANC Youth League for co-operation on this matter.

We have recently encountered some problems resulting from forged documentation and identity papers received from UNETPSA applicants in Hungary.

Although this matter has now been resolved and the scholarships to the applicants in question have been terminated, we continue having difficulty in establishing the authenticity of letters issued presumably by the representative of the African National Congress in Hungary.

To avoid incidents such as this from occurring again, we would appreciate your assistance in verifying for instance the authenticity of the attached letter from the ANC representative in Hungary, Mr. Puso Leonard Tladi and clarifying for us as to whether it is a standard norm for an ANC representative to issue statements without using ANC's letterhead or its official seal.

You will undoubtedly agree with us that these letters can very easily be written by other individuals by forging ANC representative's name and signature.

It is for this reason that UNETPSA requests statements to be issued on organization's letterhead and signed duly by respective representatives.
