'Seventy-six deaths and 32 injuries were recorded during this period. The figures are higher than last week's total of 43 deaths and 23 injuries.

Mgllante Related Actions account for 58 deaths and 52 injuries, with incidents reported only in PWV and Natal.

For the final time in several weeks, the death and injury toll in Natal; 31 and 28 respectively, not only exceeded that in the PWV, but also exceeded Natal's weekly average of 20 over the past two months. This raises concern that amid the attention paid to the violence in the PVW, especially since the Bolpatong massacre, that violence will again increase in Natal, and perhaps 90 unnoticed.

The death and injury toll in the PWV (27 and 24) is higher than last week's totals of 17 and 7 respectively.

KPolice reported that on the 5th July 3 man was killed and two men seriously injured in three separate incidents. The deceased had been hacked to death and one of the injured set alight.

IJohannesburg

Four train attacks, which claimed 2 lives and injured 5 people, were recorded in the Berea Johannesburg area.

iSoweto

Five deaths and 16 injuries were recorded. Two train attacks accounted for the death of 1 person and four injuries. 1118 remaining deaths and injuries were recorded in incidents in Klipspruit, Mapetia, Meadowlands and Orlando West.

gTwo deaths were recorded in Sebokeng.

East Rand

Twelve deaths and 1 injury were recorded. Two train attacks accounted for two of the deaths. A further 6 deaths and the injury were recorded in incidents in Katlehong. The remaining deaths were recorded in incidents in Daveyton and Vosloorus.

. Meet Rand

?On the 5th July, 4 men were killed when their white Toyota Corolla was fired at as they drove out of the Kagiso Hostel at 7:45pm. All four victims were shot in the head and died instantly. Police identified three of the victims as Mr Sipho Maioia. Mr VVilltam Majola and Mr M M Mkatho.

:83): deaths and 5 injuries were recorded. On the 1st July, 5 people, including a woman, were killed and five injured, two seriously, in an attack on a KwaMashu heund train at the Eft'ingham Station. The police reported that a group of men started firing at passengers playing cards at about 6:45pm, as the train pulled out of the station. Some residents alleged that there was a rumour circulating shortly before the incident that trains would be attacked. and as a result a number of people were not using the trains. The other death was recorded in Malugazi.

. Ten deaths and 16 injuries were recorded. Two incidents in Bishopstowe claimed 2 lives and left 11 people injured. In Pietermaritzburg on the 3rd July, 3 men and a woman were shot dead and several people injured by an unknown man in a bus near Tayler's Halt. The Inkatha Institute reported that the victims have been identified as IFP members and supporters. In Swayimane on the 2nd July, 3 people were bludgeoned to death and one person seriously injured when a homestead was attacked and on the 4th July, the Inkatha Institute reported that Mr Mvimbezeli Mchunu, the chairperson of the IFP Nomganga branch, was killed. Mr Mchunuts son, a young girl and two women were injured in the attack.

N Qoast

Five deaths and four injuries were recorded. On the 2nd July in KwaBonambi 4 people were shot dead and 3 people injured when seven armed gunmen entered a local store and opened fire on the occupants. Separate incidents in Eshowe and Ngwenyane accounted for the other death and injury.

8 Coast

ETen deaths and 3 injuries were recorded. On the 4th July in Bhomele, Murchison. 7 people were killed when a mini-bus taxi was ambushed by gunmen as it was leaving the home of an ANC zone! organiser, Mr Shezi. Those killed were Mr Shezi's mother, his grandmother, his brother and four friends. The remaining deaths and injuries were recorded in separate incidents in Megabeni and Mtengwane.
