Following the last visit of the UIDP Evaluation Mission to this project last September, the ANC Department of Education has decided to have the following elements added into the Project Document with effect from January 1986, namely:-

1. Consultancy Services:
The Solomon Mahlangu Freedom College require consultancy services in

a) Curriculum Development both for the Primary and Secondary Sectors;

b) The setting up and running of laboratories;

- c) Auxlio-visual Aids (both basic technical know-how and use)
- d) Examinations.
- 2. Recruitment of properly qualified and experienced (preferably married) teachers capable of handling secondary classes through to Form VI:
 - a) Physics (1) b) Chemistry (1)
 - c) Biology (1)
 - d) Mathematics (1)
 - e) English (1
 - f) Literature in English (1)
 - g) Adult Education (2) (SOMAFCO and Dakawa)

It is proposed that these teachers should commence their responsibilities by not later than July 1986. An added advantage will be the ability to deal with remedial situations.

- 3. Funding for Instructors for Vocational Education in the areas of:
 - a) Typing, bookkeeping and Office Practice;
 - b) Electronics;
 - c) Woodwork;
 - d) Metalwork
 - e) Agriculture;
 - f) Home Economics;
 - g) Arts and Crafts.

We should also be pleased if authorisation can be obtained as soon as possible to enable us to send one person to Nairobi to obtain Proforma Invoices for local purchase of equipment for Agriculture, Home Economics, Arts and Crafts as well as for Metalwork.
