re: SCHOLARSHIP ASSISTANCE - TINY AND LINDIWE KINGUI:

Please refer to your letter of April 2nd, in connection with the above matter. I am to point out that there appears to be a number of problems regarding your request.

I am directed to inform you that the Organisation would find it extremely difficult to overlook the laws of the host country to which your daughter is, by virtue of her marriages, a citizen. Her children are citizens of this country and she remains lawfully married to a citizen of this country.

It is not clear to us that the children of your daughter can be deprived of their citizenship by the fact of a divorce between their mother and their father. In any rate, we assume that the children are the subject of your daughter and her present husband.

We trust that you will appreciate the grounds for the Organisation's inability to assist in this matter.
