Thank you very much ~ without you the exhibition would not have been the success it was,

I can quite confidently say that my aim to promote cultural ties between South Africa and Israel through art, was achieved. our sales were good compared to the other international galleries some Sf Wwiom cidimot sel] anythung at all. We sold approximately 14 works and amongst these were two sculptures by Madeleine Minich d'Brnay- both of which were brought by collectors and connoisseurs.
