World public holidays 1981

Where general public holidays are not uniform throughout a country the names of some main towns are specified; some of the holidays indicated do not apply to all business sectors. It should be emphasised that this is a simplified table and that in some countries there are also (a) bank holidays (b) local holidays for a particular city and (c) religious holidays difficult to forecast exactly at the time of going to press; this applies mainly to Muslim lunar holidays, for which the dates shown in this Diary are approximate. Further, dates of holidays are sometimes changed or announced by the authorities concerned at times varying up to their actual occurrence. In many countries the day or half-day preceding or following an official holiday may also be regarded as holidays. This information has generally been supplied by the London representative of each country.

Sunday is observed as a holiday, and Saturday often as a holiday, in the countries listed with the exceptions of Egypt and Saudi Arabia (Friday and often Thursday) and Israel (Saturday). Any regular public holidays falling on a Sunday or other regular weekly holiday are included; the following or preceding day is also shown as a holiday when observed in such cases.

Personal annual holidays are not included in this table; in the northern hemisphere these are usually taken during July and August (in France, for example, particularly in August), and in the southern hemisphere during December and January, especially over the Christmas and New Year period. In the northern hemisphere, the period over Christmas and New Year is increasingly being used as a holiday; in, for example, Japan and United Kingdom.
